RESPECTIVE FUNCTIONS OF THE BOARD OF GOVERNORS AND PRINCIPAL IN RELATION TO

ADMISSIONS

The task of selecting pupils for admission will be undertaken by the Board of Governors subject to the directive of the Department of Education. It will not be delegated to an Admissions Sub-Committee.

ADMISSIONS CRITERIA

During the admissions procedure when applying the criteria <u>punctual applications</u> will be considered before <u>late</u> <u>applications</u> are considered. The application procedure opens on 10 January 2025 at 12noon (GMT) and an application submitted by the closing date of 24 January 2025 at 12noon (GMT) will be treated as a <u>punctual application</u>. An application received after 12noon (GMT) on 24 January 2025 and up to 4 pm on 29 January 2025 will be treated as a <u>late application</u>, this is also the last date and time for processing a change of preference in <u>exceptional circumstances</u>. After 4 pm on 29 January 2025 no applications will be processed until after the close of procedure on 9 April 2025.

COMPULSORY SCHOOL AGE

Any child who reaches their 4th Birthday on or before 1st July 2025 is of Compulsory School Age. Under the School Age (NI) Act which became Law in Northern Ireland in April 2022 'compulsory school age' also includes those children who deferred commencing Primary 1 in September 2024 as defined by the new School Age (NI) Act (both groups to be treated equally).

Parents/guardians considering sending their children to this school are invited to make a prior visit, to see the school in action and to talk to the Principal and teachers.

If the school's admission numbers has not been reached the school will enrol all the pupils whose parents/guardians wish them to attend. In any year when these numbers are exceeded the Governors will select pupils by applying the following criteria in the order set down.

Priority will be given to children resident in Northern Ireland at the time of their proposed admission to the those who are not so resident

When considering which children should be selected for admission, the Board of Governors will only take into account information which is detailed on or attached to the application form. Parents/guardians should therefore ensure that all information pertaining to their child and relevant to the school's admissions criteria is stated on the application form.

ADMISSIONS CRITERIA - YEAR 1

1 Children of compulsory school age who have or have had, a brother/sister, half-brother/half-sister enrolled at the school.

- 2 Children who attend McClintock Children's Centre or have unsuccessfully applied for admission to the Children's Centre.
- 3 Children whose father/mother/guardian is a past pupil of the school.
- 4 Children of compulsory school age whose father/mother/guardian is an employee (or about to join the school staff) or governor at the school.
- 5 Other children of compulsory school age wishing to attend McClintock PS, with priority given to those living closest to the school using Google Maps.

In the event of over-subscription in the last criterion which can be applied then selection for all places in this category will be on the basis of the initial letter of the surname as per the birth certificate, in the revised order set out below:-

A T W E C Mac I Q M Y F L J N Mc S G U H X D V K Z R O P B

The order was determined by a randomised selection of letters of the alphabet. In the event of surnames beginning with the same letter the subsequent letters of the surnames will be used in alphabetical order. In the event of two identical surnames the alphabetical order of the initials of the forenames as per the birth certificate will be used.

YEAR 1 ADMISSIONS - AFTER THE BEGINNING OF THE SCHOOL YEAR

Children who apply to enter school during the academic year will be considered using the same criteria as for Year 1 provided that the school does not exceed its enrolment number.

DUTY TO VERIFY

The Board of Governors reserves the right to require such supplementary evidence as it may determine to support or verify information on any applicant's Application.

If the requested evidence is not provided to the Board of Governors by the deadline given, this will result in the withdrawal of an offer of a place. Similarly, if information is supplied which appears to be false or misleading in any material way, the offer of a place will be withdrawn.

WAITING LIST POLICY

The school does not operate a Waiting List Policy.

ADMISSIONS CRITERIA - YEARS 2-7

Pupils will be considered for enrolment in Years 2-7 provided that:

(i) The school does not exceed its enrolment number.

If at the time of the consideration of the applications there are more eligible applicants than places then the Admissions Criteria for Year 1 pupils will be applied.
